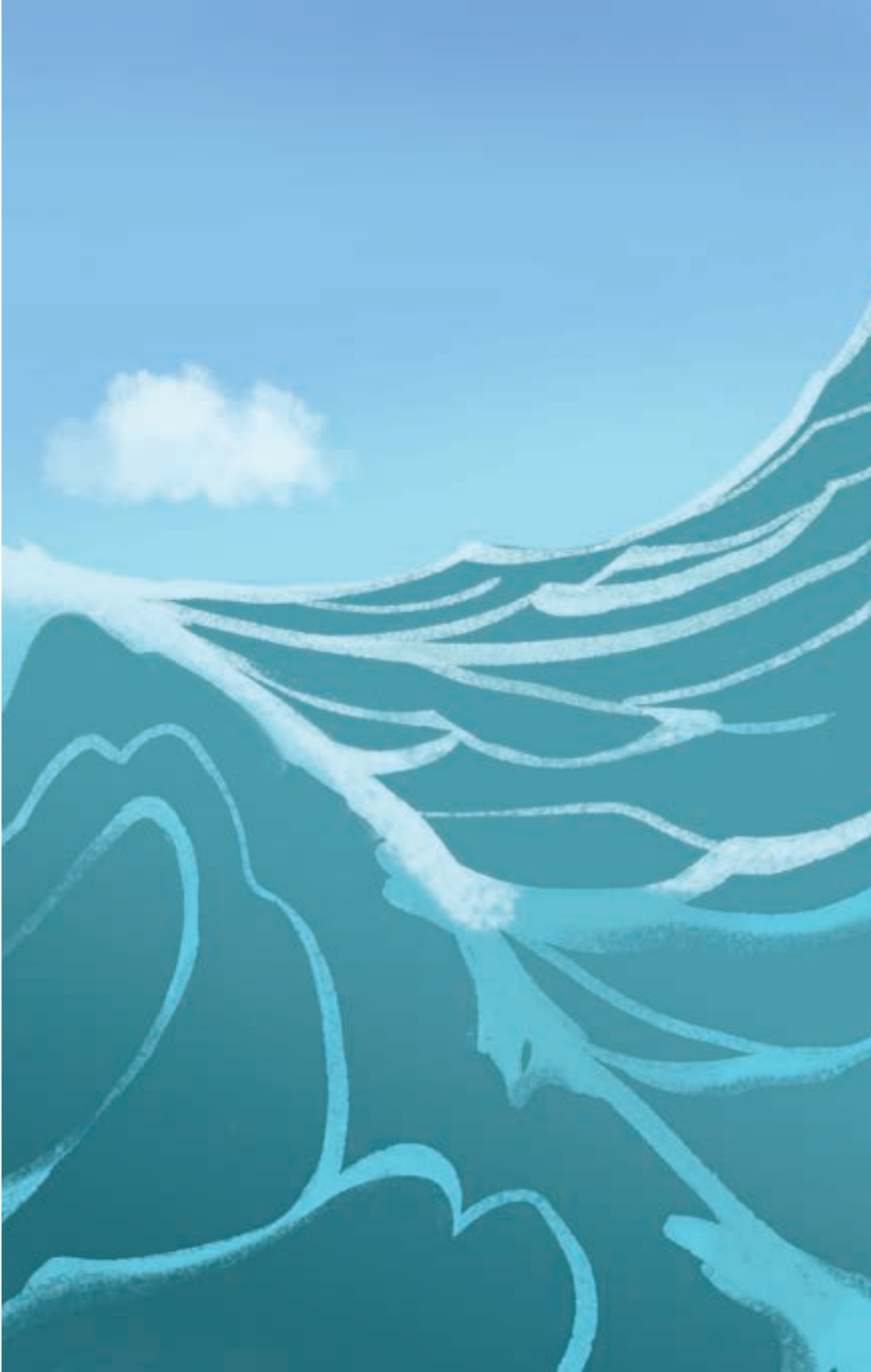
God spent six days creating his world.

were formed on the fourth day.

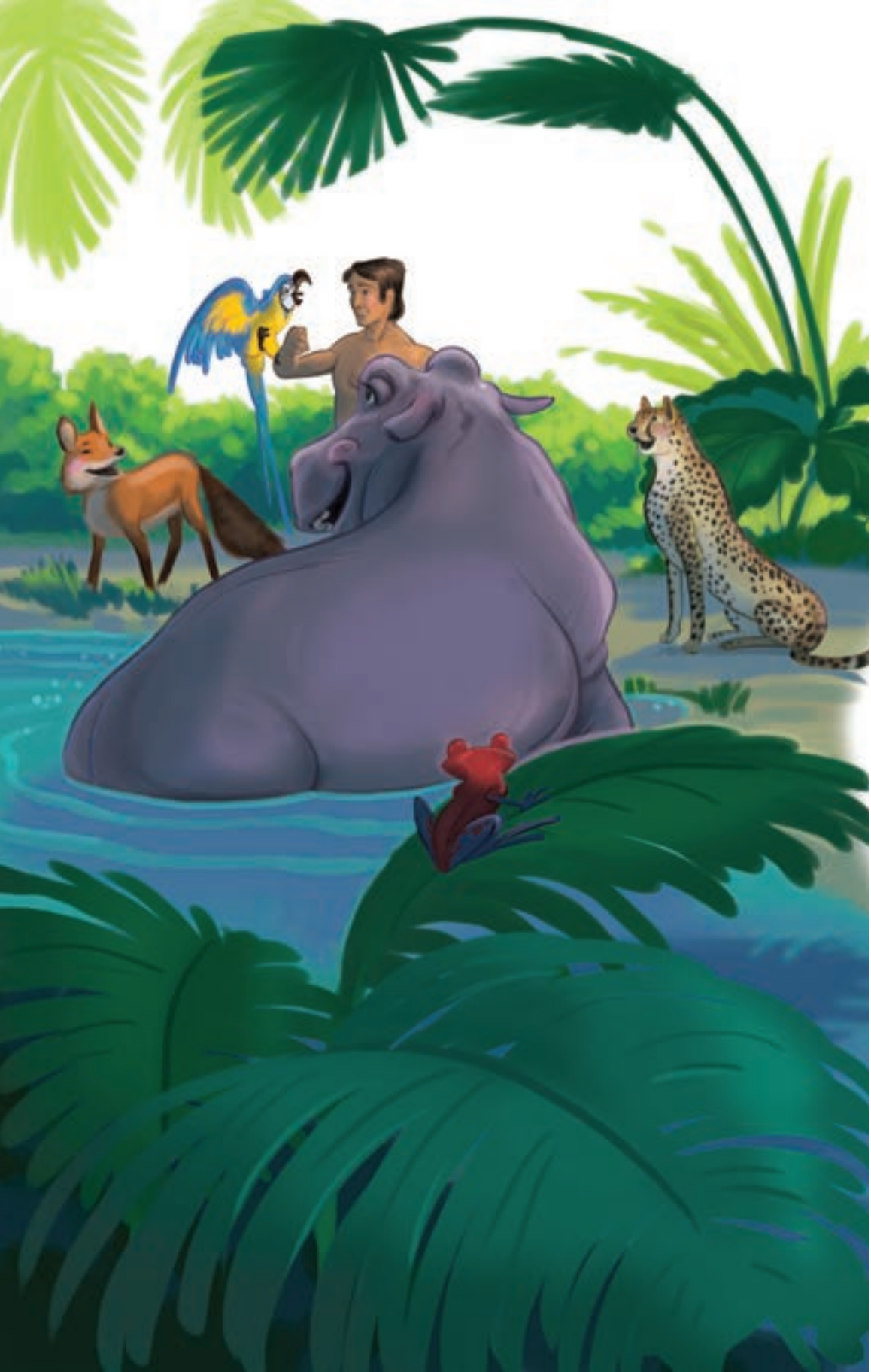


These lit up the sky and would

He made man!


Man was God's best creation of all!

man could use it all.

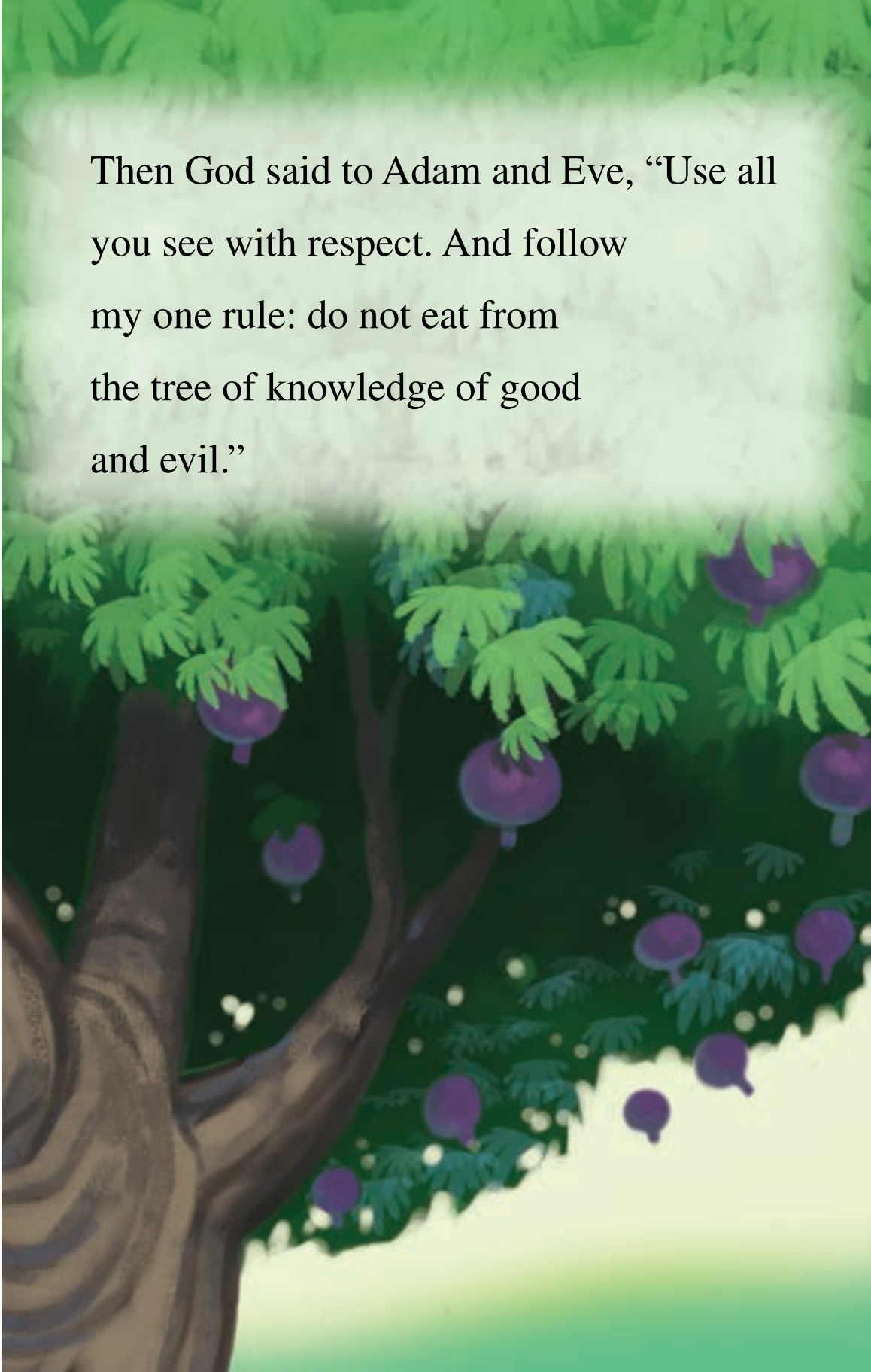


God blessed the man with

Then God said to Adam and Eve, “Use all you see with respect. And follow my one rule: do not eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil.”

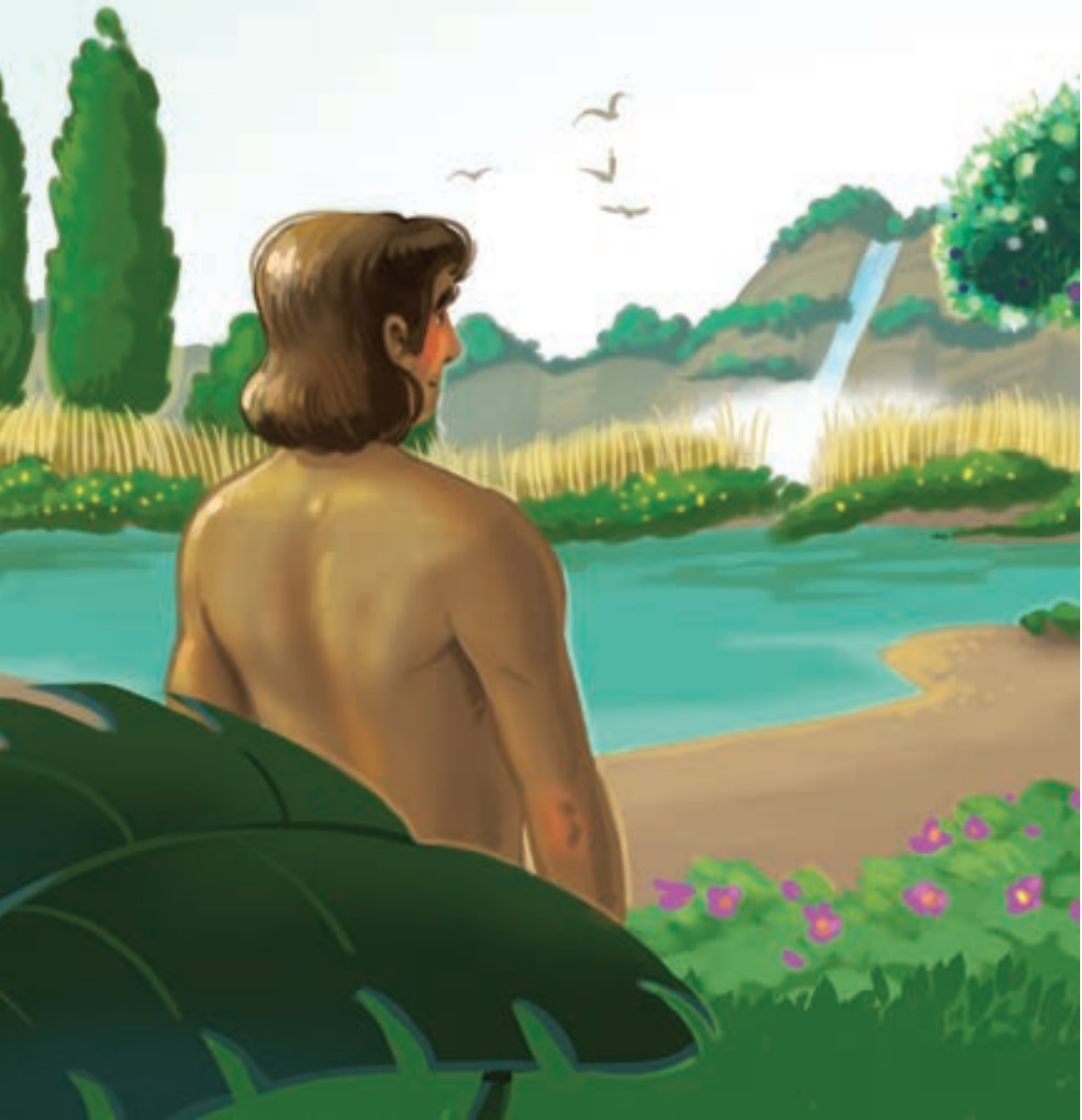


God was happy.
