

## God's Rainbow Promise



God told Noah to build an ark and take two of every animal with him when he and his family got on. After everyone was inside, the rain began to fall. And fall. When the flood finally ended, God put a beautiful rainbow in the sky. It was a sign of his promise to never flood the whole earth again. Make this rainbow to remember that God keeps his promises!



### What you need:

- Colored construction paper (white, red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple)
- Clear tape or glue stick
- Scissors
- Blue or black marker



### What you do:

1. Cut the colored construction paper (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple) in half lengthwise, and then into 1-inch strips.
2. Starting with the red strips, create a paper chain by taping or gluing the ends of a strip of construction paper together to form a loop. Insert another strip of paper into the loop. Tape or glue the ends together.
3. Continue adding strips and loops until the paper chain is as long as you want—at least four of each color.
4. Repeat the process with all the other color strips to create a total of six paper chains, one per color.
5. With the marker, draw a large, fluffy white cloud on the white construction paper.
6. Cut out the cloud with your scissors.
7. Tape your paper chains to the backside of the cloud.
8. Display your rainbow for all to see!
