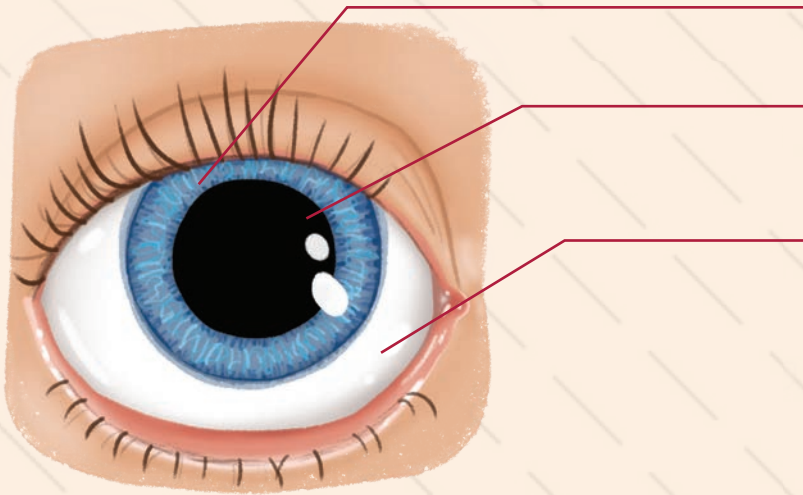




# THE EYES HAVE IT

To learn more about eyes, check out devotion 36 in *Indescribable*.

God designed the parts of your eyes to work together and create one of the most marvelous and exc-eye-ting senses you have—sight! Label the eye and discover the function of each part.



The **sclera**—or white of the eye—helps give it its shape.

The **lens** is behind the pupil and helps focus light onto the retina.

The **vitreous humor** is a thick fluid that fills the eye between the lens and the retina.

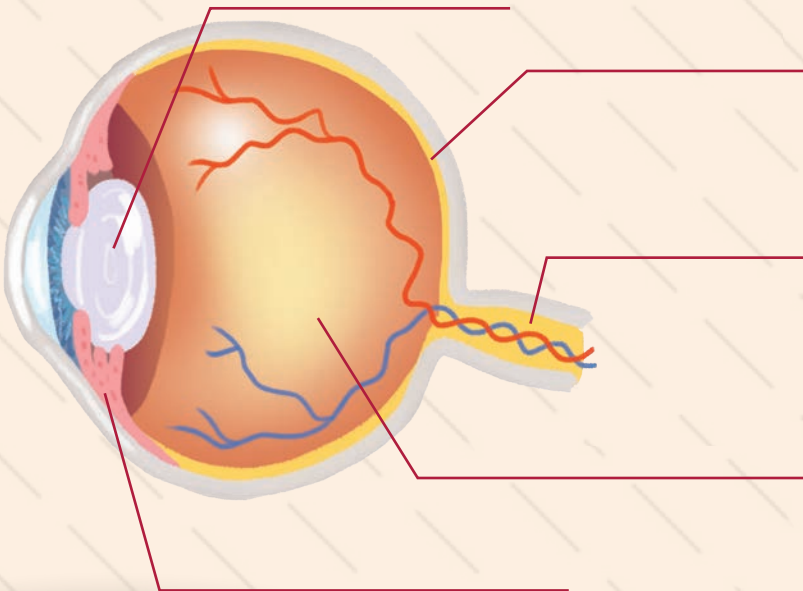
The **optic nerve** carries electrical impulses to the brain.

The **pupil** is the black center of the eye. It allows light to enter your eye.

The **iris** is the colorful part of the eye.

The **ciliary muscles** help the lens focus and see things at different distances.

The **retina** is at the back of the eye and turns light into electrical impulses.

## GET ROOTED

## HOW TO “ROOT” A POTHOS PLANT

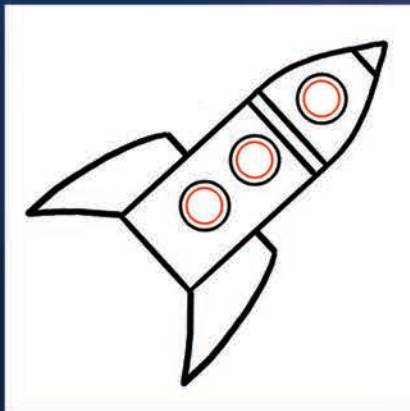
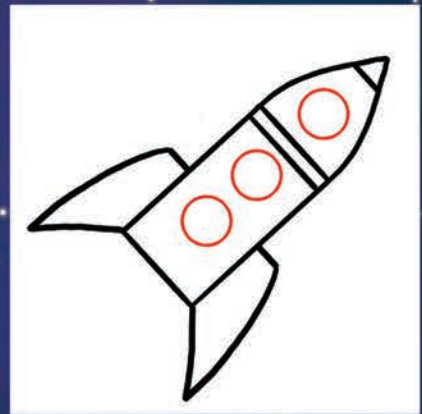
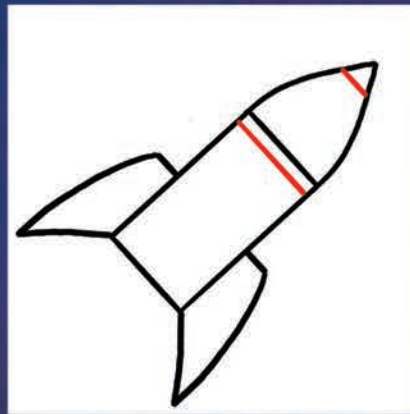
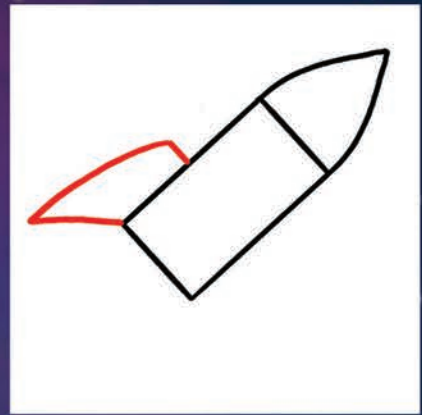
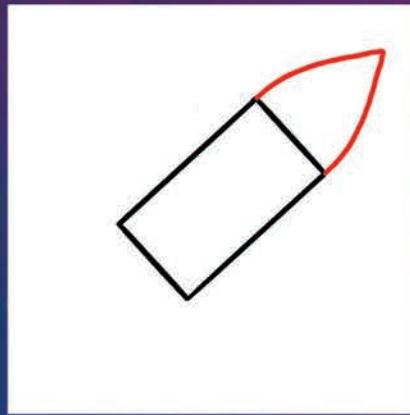
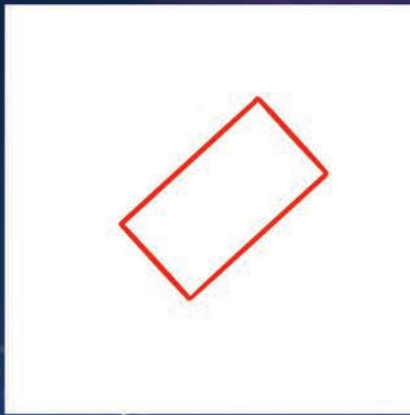
1. With a grown-up’s help, cut off a four- to six-inch piece of a pothos plant with at least four leaves. (A *pothos* is a type of houseplant with heart-shaped leaves.)
2. Snip off the leaf closest to the cut end, and place the stem in a glass of water.
3. Put the glass in a spot that gets lots of light but no direct sunlight.
4. Roots should start to appear over the next 30 days or so.
5. Once you see roots, wait 10 days before planting it in a small pot of dirt. Then watch your plant grow up strong!

# BLAST OFF!

To learn more about rockets and gravity, check out devotion 72 in *How Great Is Our God*.

Gravity is the invisible force that pulls an object *down* to another object—like how our feet are pulled down to Earth. Rockets overpower the pull of gravity by burning fuel. The burning fuel creates hot gases that blow out of the rocket so fast they break the hold of gravity and push the rocket up into space.

Follow these steps to learn how to draw a rocket!

**DID YOU KNOW?**

A spacecraft must be traveling 7 miles per second or over 25,000 miles per hour to break free from Earth's gravity. That speed is called escape velocity.

# THE GREAT SPACE SEARCH

In 1969, Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first people ever to walk on the Moon. To get there, they traveled over 238,000 miles on board the Apollo 11 spacecraft. That's like walking around the Earth 9 ½ times!

# SEEING BEHIND THE SCENES

Missionaries live away from home and teach others about Jesus. But they don't work alone! Lots of people help them "behind the scenes," doing important things others don't see. But God sees! In fact, He uses behind-the-scenes people to do *big* things for His kingdom. And you can be one of them! Check out these ways you can help:

- 1** Choose a missionary your church supports and pray for them every day.
- 2** Be a pen pal to a missionary's kid—because it's tough being away from home and things you know. Ask your parent or Sunday School teacher to help you connect with a missionary kid your age. Then write letters to each other, telling about life where you each live.
- 3** Ask a missionary family what foods or items they miss most from home. Have a yard sale or a bake sale to raise money and send them those things.
- 4** When missionaries come for a visit, hang out with the kids your own age or offer to babysit their younger kids.
- 5** Look for businesses that use the money they make to help missionaries and other Christians in poor or war-torn countries. Ask your parents about how your family can support these businesses.

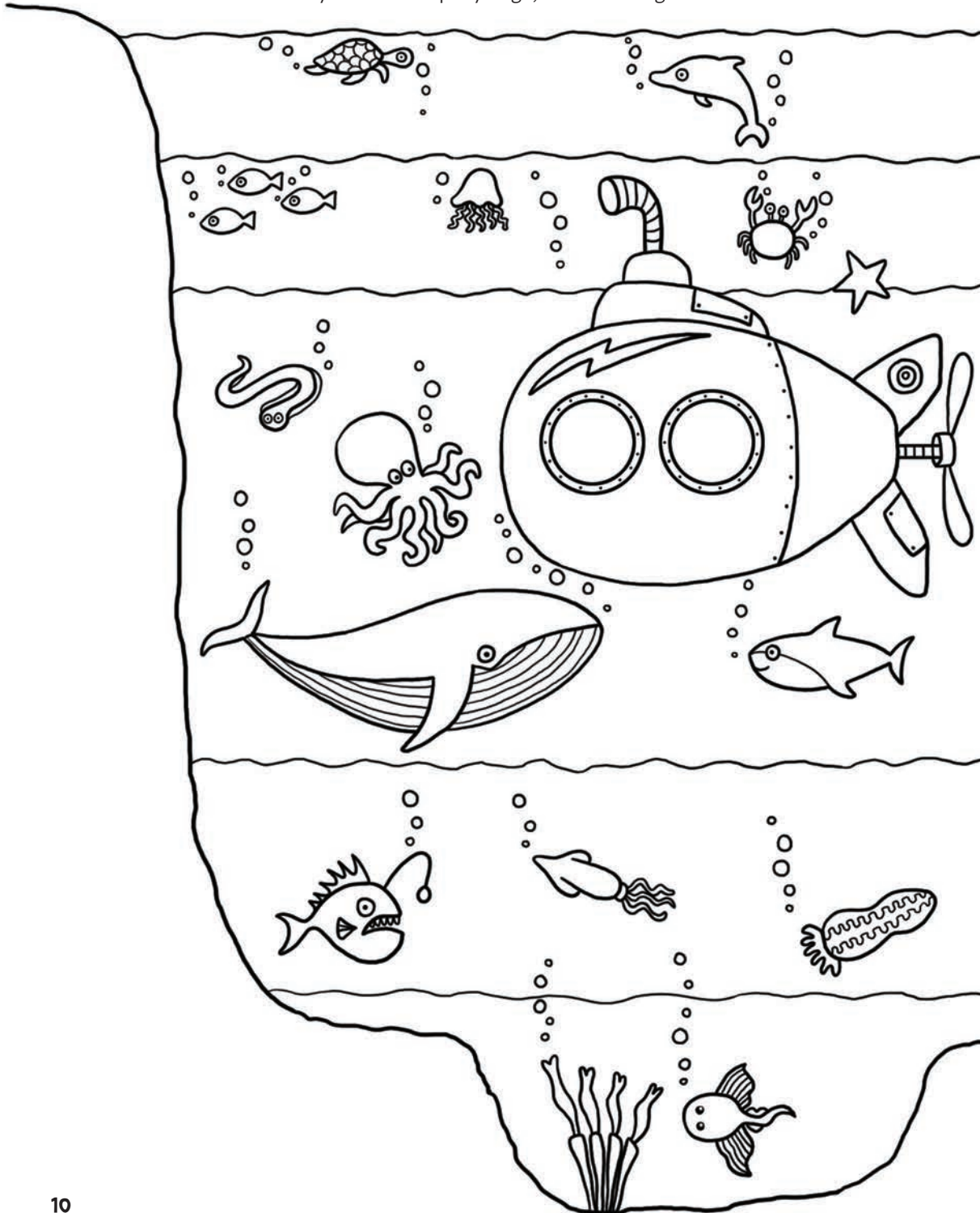
# THE DEEPER YOU GO
