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INTRODUCTION

“If Only I Had Known . . .”

Can you remember thinking those words during some of the more painful moments in your life? Even saying them out loud? Maybe you put off getting those physical checkups or tests your doctor (or maybe your spouse) kept mentioning year after year after year. Then, when you finally keep the appointment, the test results are painful. “If only I had known.”

Maybe you never gave much thought to retirement or investment accounts during your working career. You had enough to think about each day without borrowing trouble from tomorrow. But then retirement came, and you had to figure out how to support yourself (and maybe continue supporting your family) without a regular salary. “If only I had known.”

Or maybe you’ve had a friend or family member drift into the dangerous waters of self-harm or suicide. They never talked openly about their depression, but the signs became clearer once you saw them in the mirror called hindsight. You would have reached out if you’d been aware of what they

were thinking and feeling. You would have helped. You *could* have helped. “If only I had known.”


One of the universal realities among human beings is our confinement to the present. We can study the past and learn lessons from those who came before us. We can take an active interest in the present and observe quite a lot about what’s currently happening. But we can’t see the future. We can’t know anything for certain about what’s to come, and there’s very little we can even predict accurately based on our current knowledge.

That’s why the Bible is such an incredible gift. Yes, God’s Word offers a record of history, including key insights about God’s nature and character. Yes, Scripture offers much value in our present lives, including wise principles for living in alignment with God’s will.

But the Bible also opens a window to the future. It shows us not just what *can* be, but what *will* be. It reveals what will happen during the most critical phase of human history—the phase we often refer to as the “end times.”

This is the marvelous treasure chest we call biblical prophecy. Scattered throughout the pages of God’s Word like veins in a mine are glimpses, visions, and promises of what God has planned for the end of this age—and beyond. And because these promises come from God, rather than from humanity, we can count on them. We can use them as a firm foundation as we navigate both current events and events to come.

While we often think of biblical prophecy as a New Testament phenomenon, particularly connected with the



book of Revelation, the majority of prophetic passages are actually found in the Old Testament. We're going to take a deeper look at many of those passages in these pages. We'll also explore key portions of Revelation and other New Testament prophecies.

Don't let your life be defined by the regret of "If only I had known." Use these next sixty days to learn more about who God is and what He has in store for our world. Let's work together to mine the lode of biblical prophecy so that we can *know* what's coming—and so that we can approach the future not with fear, but with confidence.

DAY 1

ISRAEL REBORN

Prophetic Connection: *“For behold, the days are coming,” says the LORD, “that I will bring back from captivity My people Israel and Judah,” says the LORD. “And I will cause them to return to the land that I gave to their fathers, and they shall possess it” (Jeremiah 30:3).*

May 14, 1948, was a pivotal day in human history. On that afternoon, a car carrying prominent Jewish leader David Ben-Gurion rushed down Rothschild Boulevard in Tel Aviv, Israel, and stopped in front of the Tel Aviv Art Museum. Four o’clock was only minutes away, and inside, more than four hundred people—Jewish religious and political leaders and press representatives from all over the world—were assembled in an auditorium, anxiously awaiting his arrival. Ben-Gurion quickly bounded up the steps. Precisely at four o’clock local time, he stepped to the podium, called the meeting to order, and read these historic words:¹

This right is the natural right of the Jewish people to be masters of their own fate, like all other nations, in their own sovereign State. Accordingly, we . . . are here assembled . . . and by virtue of our natural and historic right, and on the

strength of the resolution of the General Assembly of the United Nations, hereby declare the establishment of the Jewish State in Eretz-Israel, to be known as the State of Israel.²

Six thousand miles away, President Truman sat in the Oval Office, reading a forty-word statement about to be released to the press. He penciled in a few added words, then signed his approval and noted the time. It was 6:10 P.M. One minute later, the White House press secretary read the release to the world. The United States had officially recognized the birth of the modern nation of Israel.

Isaiah's prophecy, written 740 years before the birth of Jesus, declared: "Who has heard such a thing? Who has seen such things? Shall the earth be made to give birth in one day? Or shall a nation be born at once?" (Isaiah 66:8). Secular Israel was born that day.

The return of the Jews to Israel in 1948 was an astounding event unprecedented in world history. Never had a decimated ancient people managed to retain their individual identity through almost twenty centuries and reestablish their nation in their original homeland. The event was specifically prophesied, and it happened exactly as foretold. It was clearly a miraculous act of God.

REMEMBER: Despite long passages of time and unexpected obstacles, God is faithful to fulfill His promises. You can trust Him even when things seem uncertain.

GOD'S COVENANT WITH ABRAHAM

Prophetic Connection: *God made four vital promises to Abraham regarding the nation of Israel. We can see from his-
tory (and the present day) how those prophecies were fulfilled.*

The story of Israel begins in the book of Genesis. The very proportion of the coverage tells us something about the importance of Israel. Only two chapters are given to the whole story of creation. One chapter records the fall of man. Eight chapters cover the thousands of years from creation to the time of Abram. Then we find thirty-eight chapters that deal with the life stories of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob—the progenitors of the Jewish race. Apparently, God finds Abraham and his descendants to be of enormous importance.

The Almighty God of heaven and earth made a binding covenant with Abraham, who was to be the father of the Jewish nation. The provisions of that covenant are recorded in Genesis 12:1-3. When you read that passage, you'll notice that God's covenant with Abraham consists of four unconditional promises.

First, God promised to bless Abraham. For thousands of years, the very name of Abraham has been revered by

Jews, Christians, and Muslims alike—a significant portion of the world’s population.

Second, God promised to bring out of Abraham a great nation. Today more than 7 million Jews live in Israel, 7.5 million live in the U.S., and a significant Jewish population is scattered throughout the rest of the world.

Third, God promised to make Abraham a blessing to many. Just think what the world would be missing had it not been for the Jews. Without the Jews, we would have no Bible. Without the Jews, there would be no Ten Commandments, the Law that has largely been the basis of jurisprudence and statutory proceedings among most of the civilized nations of the world. Without the Jews, there would have been no Jesus. Without the Jewish Jesus, there would be no Christianity.

Fourth, God promised to bless those who bless Israel and curse those who curse her. No nation has blessed Israel like the United States of America, and no nation has been as blessed as the United States.

God has certainly kept his promises to Abraham. He has blessed him and the nation that came from him; He has multiplied his seed as the sands of the earth and stars of the sky; He has made him a blessing to the whole world; those who have blessed him have been blessed, and those who have cursed him have been cursed.

REMEMBER: Because God has been faithful to keep His ancient promises to Abraham, we can know that every promise will be fulfilled in Christ.

GOD'S CHOSEN PEOPLE

Prophetic Connection: *The tiny nation of Israel has played a major role in human history for thousands of years—and will continue to do so until the end of this age.*

When I first began studying prophecy, I remember reading an offbeat little rhyme about Israel by British journalist William Norman Ewer: “How odd of God to choose the Jews.” When you think about it, this poetic quip expresses a valid observation. Doesn’t it seem a little odd that of all the people on earth, God selected these particular people to be His chosen nation? Why would God choose the Jews?

We read about God’s choice of the Jews in Deuteronomy 7:6, where He declared the people of Israel holy, chosen to be “a people for Himself, a special treasure above all the peoples on the face of the earth.” The Bible tells us that His choice of Israel had nothing to do with merit. It was not because she was more numerous than other people in the world; she was the least (Deuteronomy 7:7). It was not because Israel was more sensitive to God than other nations. Although God called her by name, Israel did not know Him (Isaiah 45:4). It was not because Israel was more righteous

than other nations. When God later confirmed His promise of land to the Jews, He reminded them that they were a rebellious, stiff-necked people (Deuteronomy 9:6-7).

If God chose to bless the nation of Israel not because she was more populous or spiritually responsive or righteous than other nations, just why did He choose the Jews? The answer: because it was His sovereign purpose to do so. His sovereign purpose means He cares what happens to His people and their land. He is not merely a passive observer to all that is taking place in Israel. As He told the people through Moses, theirs was “a land for which the LORD your God cares; the eyes of the LORD your God are always on it, from the beginning of the year to the very end of the year” (Deuteronomy 11:12).

REMEMBER: Israel has always been central to the story of redemption. As the world draws near to the end times, Israel will continue to play an important part in God’s plans.
