# Note to Parents

The gospel is often called “the Good News,” and that’s because it’s the best news ever! God loves us so much that he sent his only Son to pay for our sin by dying for us. Then Jesus rose from the dead, proving that if we believe and accept what Christ has done for us, we can be made right with God and have eternal life. Wow!

The Good News is profound yet simple. Jesus prayed this prayer: “O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, thank you for hiding these things from those who think themselves wise and clever, and for revealing them to the childlike” (Matthew 11:25). This book conveys God’s amazing grace and plan of salvation in simple terms children (and grown-ups) will understand and remember.

**As you read through each part of this story, encourage your child to shout out each focus word:**

**Wow! Uh-oh. Yes! Ahh. Wow!**

**Wow:** God, the Creator, loves us (see John 3:16; John 1:1-5).

**Uh-oh:** We have all sinned, and the result is a broken world and separation from God (see Romans 3:23).

**Yes:** Jesus died for us and rose from the dead. Through him, we are offered forgiveness and a new beginning . . . if we say yes (see Ephesians 2:8-9; Romans 5:9).

**Ahh:** Saying yes to Jesus gives us eternal life and peace (see Acts 3:19-20).

**Wow:** As we grow in faith, we’ll want to tell others the Good News (see Matthew 28:18-19).






Back in the beginning, the world was still dark.
