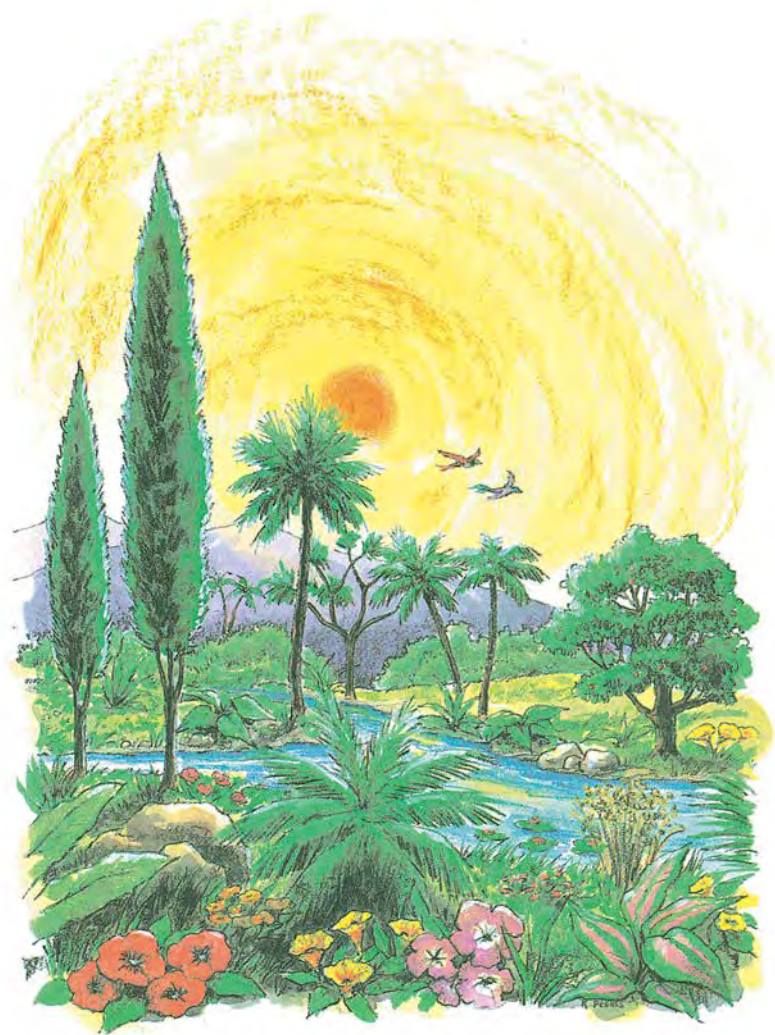
Many of the stories have obvious applications for young children. A simple question brings home the truth of each story, helping to anchor important facts in children’s minds.

the sun.

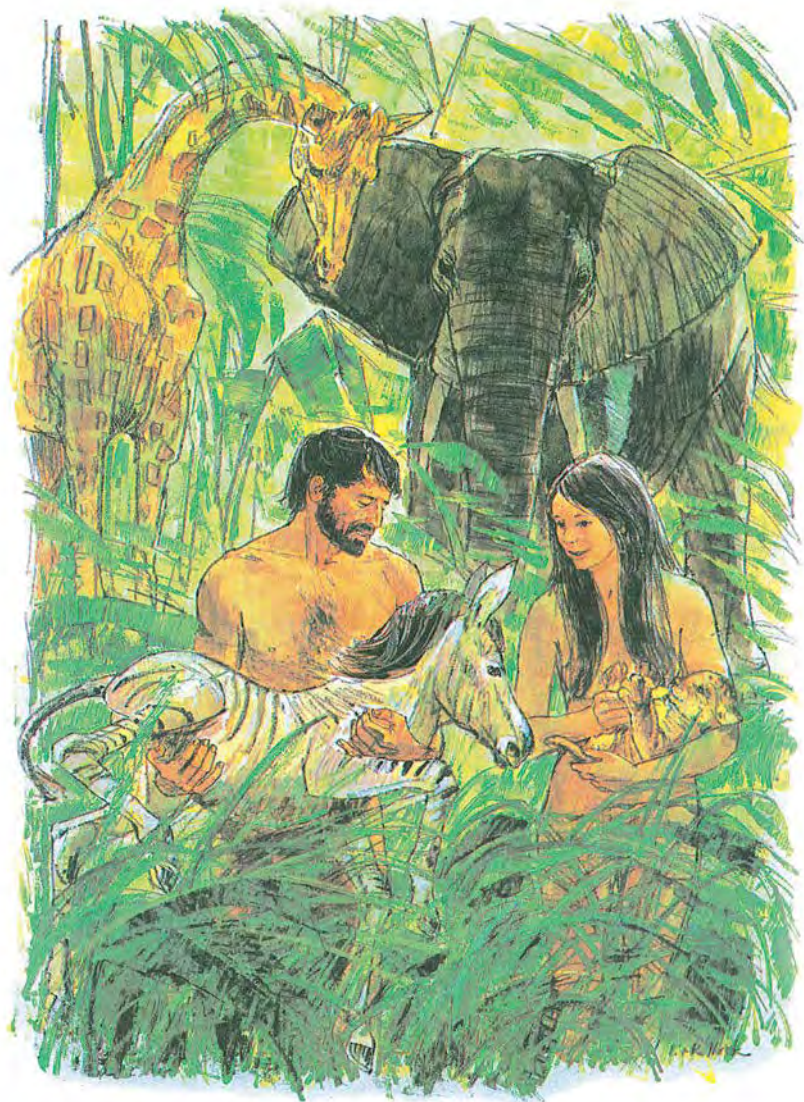
Who made the sun?

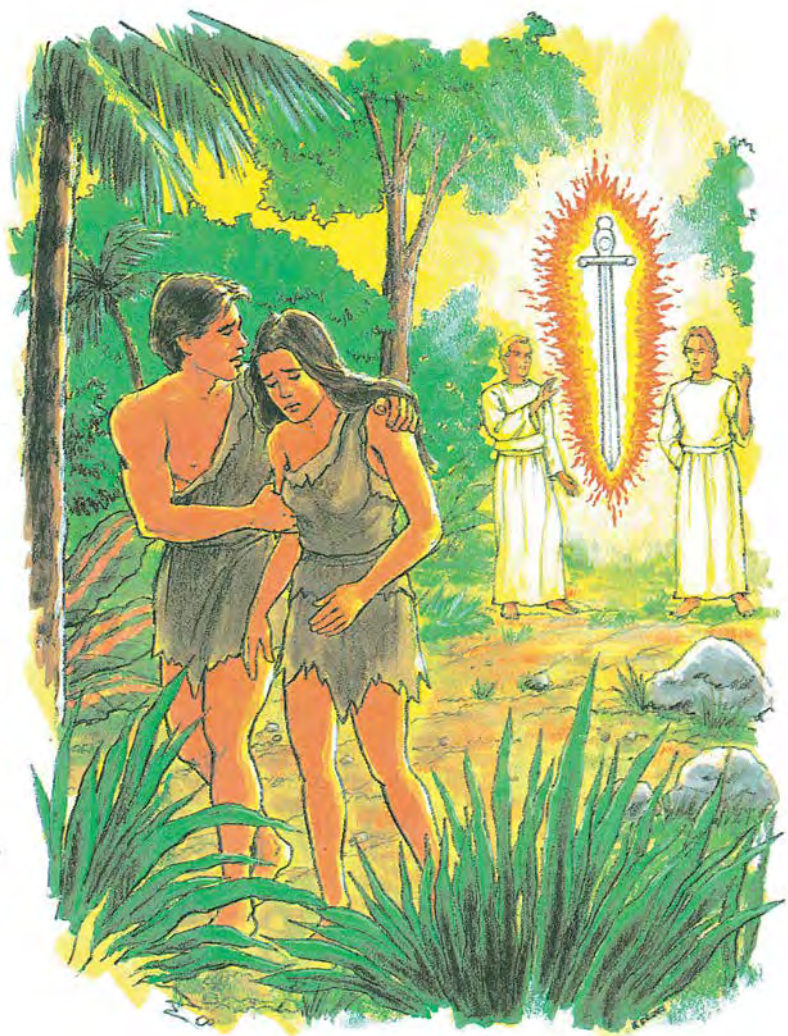
Who made Adam and Eve?

GENESIS 1-2



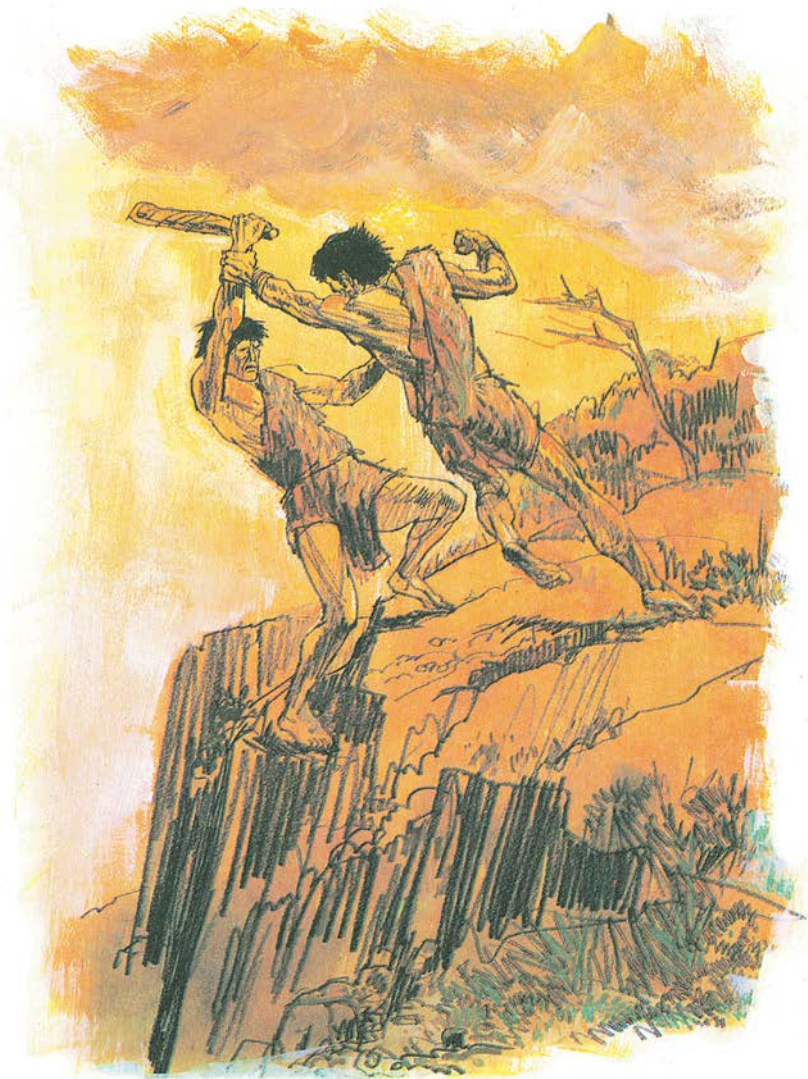

Why must Adam and Eve leave their nice home?



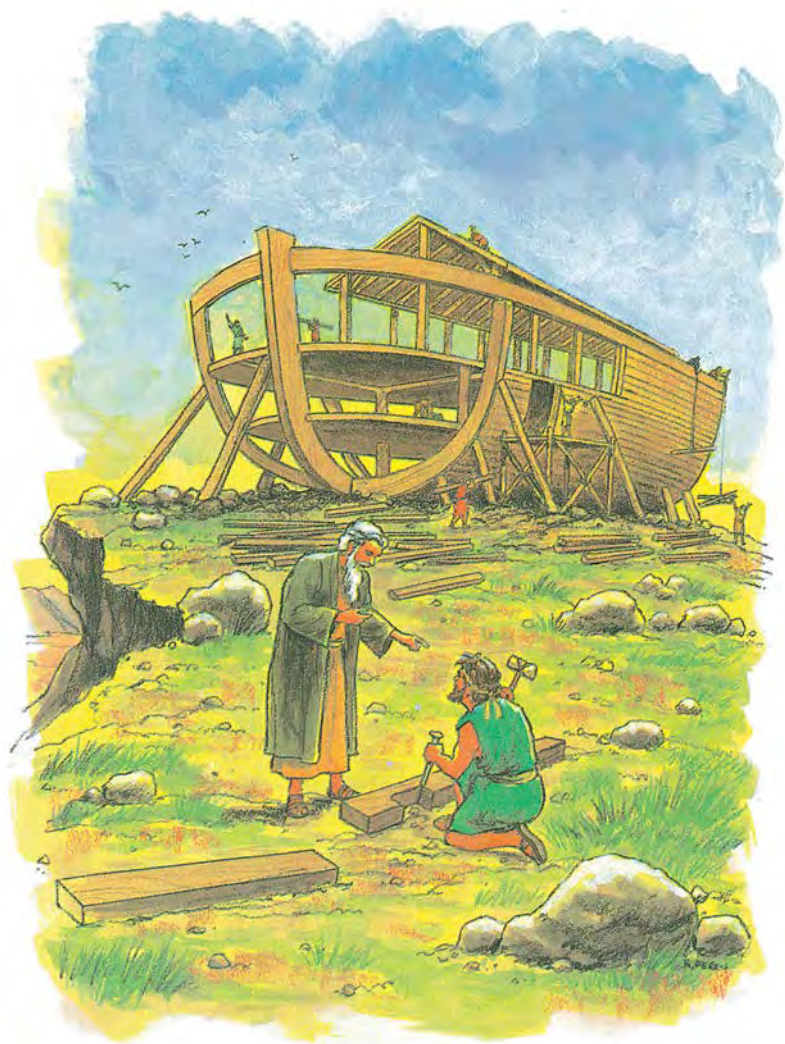

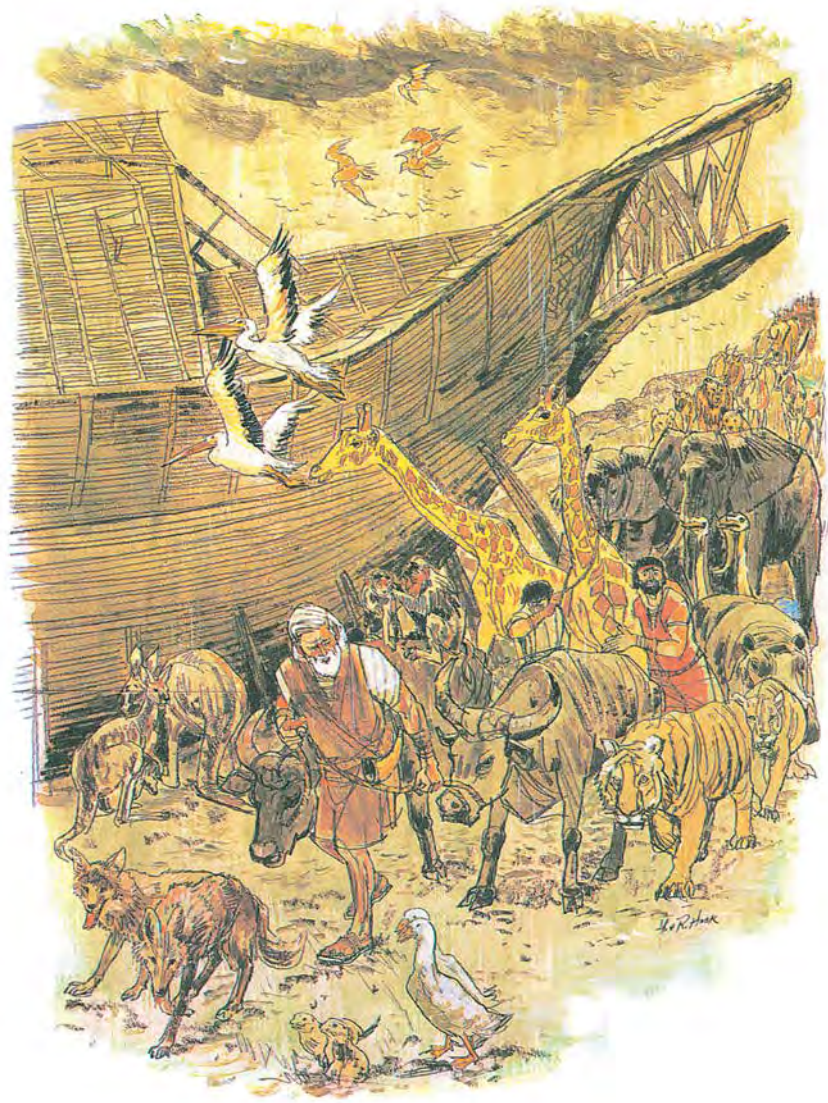
Where will Noah and his family be when it rains?
