TODAY'S PROMISE

Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning.

LAMENTATIONS 3:23

TODAY'S THOUGHT

Life is a series of beginnings, and how you enter into them makes all the difference. Although the thought of new beginnings sometimes makes you feel anxious, remember that you experience them all the time. Each day brings a whole series of new opportunities, including opportunities to get to know God better and to start over with a new attitude toward circumstances and people in your life. God's mercy toward you is new every day, no matter what you've done or how you've treated him or other people the day before. That means you don't have to be burdened by yesterday's failures or regrets.

Do you give new mercies each day to the people you live and work with, just as God gives new mercies to you?

TODAY'S PROMISE

Create in me a clean heart, O God. Renew a loyal spirit within me.

PSALM 51:10

TODAY'S THOUGHT

You harvest what you plant. Pumpkin seeds produce pumpkins. Sunflower seeds produce sunflowers. If you have sinful desires and thoughts, it is evidence that some bad seeds have been planted in your heart, and you need to do some weeding. You must beg the Lord to plant within you a clean heart so that your life will produce clean thoughts, motives, and actions. Complete renewal cannot be accomplished yet. None of us will be entirely “clean” in this life, but one of the most worthy goals you can pursue this year is purity of mind and heart.

TODAY'S PLAN

Can you make purity of mind and heart your goal for today? What might you look like a year from now—inside and out—if you met this goal not just today but every day?

CALL OF GOD

TODAY'S PROMISE

I knew you before I formed you in your mother's womb. Before you were born I set you apart and appointed you as my prophet to the nations.

JEREMIAH 1:5

TODAY'S THOUGHT

You might think that God was only speaking to the prophet Jeremiah in these verses. But God calls everyone to do a certain job, to accomplish a specific task, or to use his or her gifts in a unique way. When God calls you to do something, he will make sure you know what it is. Often you will feel a strong sense of leading from him. It's up to you to respond and walk through the door of opportunity he opens.

TODAY'S PLAN

Do you have a strong sense that God is leading you in a certain direction or asking you to serve him in some way? How can you begin to respond to God's call in practical ways today?

GIFTS

TODAY'S PROMISE

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit is the source of them all. There are different kinds of service, but we serve the same Lord. God works in different ways, but it is the same God who does the work in all of us.

1 CORINTHIANS 12:4-6

TODAY'S THOUGHT

The natural abilities you have are gifts from God, and they are often a clue to what God wants you to do. Would God give you certain talents and spiritual gifts and then not ask you to use them? You may have natural gifts in the area of cooking, entertaining, managing a business, teaching, handling money, playing an instrument, or any number of other things. Use whatever gifts you have to bring honor and glory to God. Then you will be right where you need to be to discover God's will for you and to accomplish his purpose for you.

How is God calling you to serve him with your gifts in the coming year?

TODAY'S PROMISE

Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.

TODAY'S THOUGHT

There's more to prayer than just getting an answer to a question or a solution for a problem. God often does more in your heart through your act of prayer than he does in the actual answer to your prayer. As you persist in talking and listening to God, he promises that you will gain greater understanding of yourself and your situation as well as God's purpose for you and his direction for your life.
